

RN FIRST ASSISTANT - DELINEATION OF PRIVILEGE FORM

Credentialing period effective for 2 years

MAIN FUNCTION: Functions as the assistant to the operating surgeon during the operative procedure and provides comprehensive nursing management of care during the peri-operative phase. Does not concurrently function as a scrub nurse.

EDUCATION REQUIRED: Minimal formal education required to perform the job:

1. Graduate of accredited School of Nursing - RN
2. Successful completion of RN First Assistant course and internship equivalent to one year of formal academic post-basic nursing study, which takes place at a college or university approved by the appropriate Regional Accrediting Body for Higher Education, in which the curriculum addressed all the content areas of the modules of the Core Curriculum for the RN First Assistant and college credits are awarded along with a degree or certificate, (course meets the AORN Recommended Education Standards for RN First Assistant Programs).

MINIMUM TIME TO LEARN JOB: The minimum time required to learn the job is 3 - 6 months; relative to opportunity for experience.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: Special requirements for RNFA's are:

1. Licensed as a Registered Nurse in the State of New York.
2. C.P.R. Certification (Attach a copy of certification)
3. CNOR Certification (Attach a copy of certification)
4. Minimum of 5 years diversified perioperative nursing experience; both scrubbing and circulating proficiency.
